Can you believe that May of this year marks three years of occupancy in the new building? I'm surprised how quickly time has passed since we moved over from the old building. To date we have experienced only minor issues with the new building. The geo thermal heating system has been working well and saving us money. The residents are really enjoying the new building as well; they love their privacy and independence. Several of the residents we seldom see unless they come out for special activities.



Last summer the National Guard sent out the 815th Engineering Company to do annual training. They removed several dead trees in the oxbow, re-shaped the dike along the Sheyenne River and spent countless hours landscaping various areas on the grounds. Upon completing their mission the staff of the Veterans Home sprang into action shaping and planting grass on the dike and oxbow area. By late fall the Veterans Home grounds were really looking nice. I'm anxious to see the new grass growing over all the areas that were landscaped by the guard last summer.

Over the last six months the Veterans Home has seen a flurry of activities. Fall brought the trick-ortreaters and winter brought Santa and the Christmas gang. In December, several veterans organizations volunteered to host bingo parties and gift exchanges.

This summer I'm hoping to have the fountain up and running in the oxbow pond. Everyone is excited to see the fountain shooting up water. Other fun projects we are working on is the development of a Frisbee golf course on the Veterans Home grounds and a couple of horseshoe pits.

In closing, the landscape of the Veterans Home grounds will be changing once again this summer. We have contracted with an architect to develop a plan for the demolition of the old Veterans Home. If the bids coming in are on budget, the old building will be removed by the end of summer.

The company that was chosen is called HealthMEDX. This company is based in Ozark, Missouri and has systems in nursing homes across the



United States. Many hours have been spent by staff learning and implementing the new system. We went live with the new systems February 1, 2014. The staff of the North Dakota Veterans Home have done a great job with embracing this change. The goal is that this will make documentation more efficient so that more time can be spent with the residents of the North Dakota Veterans Home.

The Administrative Committee of Veterans Affairs purchased an IN2L unit for the Veterans Home Skilled Care Unit. It did not take long to discover that it was very popular. The facility purchased another unit for Skilled Care so there can be two IN2L's per two households. Recently the activities department has been working with residents and their family members to create "My Stories" which is a virtual photo album that tells the story of the residents life. Some of the popular apps that the residents enjoy are: jukebox, Sudoku, karaoke, and mahjong. We look forward to discovering more creative uses for this ingenious form of technology.

Have you Met?

Lavonne "Vonnie"

Steele has lived at the North Dakota Veterans Home for four years and loves it. She is a local girl who like most of

us went to a country school. She had dreams of being a nurse. In a way that dream was realized as she was the care-giver for her husband Jim.

Vonnie and Jim were married the day after Christmas in 1946. She had rheumatic fever and other health issues but experienced what she called the "happiest day of her life" when she knew she was pregnant with her darling daughter Nancy. Two months after Nancy's birth, Jim was injured in an accident at work and was a paraplegic for the next 53 years until the Lord called him home.

Jim's first year following the accident was one of sorrow and pain. But his pleasant and loving attitude blossomed under Vonnie's constant and loving care. Besides her caring for Jim, Vonnie learned to milk, make hay, lay boards from the house to the barn-to provide Jim with access to the barn, and shovel snow so they could work together.

Winters were spent in the South and in 1981 Vonnie took up another occupation. She met a lady in the park and with a dozen others took up, or rather realized her passion for painting. She enjoyed this past-time while being accessible to Jim. Though she paints scenery as well as portraits, her favorite subject is Native Americans.

Vonnie enjoys the NDVH because of the people. She enjoys the friendly atmosphere and the peoples varied stories.

Her good friend Willie is important to Vonnie. She says, "We need each other." She monitors his blood sugar, and he keeps an eye on her oxygen.

As Vonnie looked back she got a smile on her face as she spoke of Nancy, her adopted children and the 16 foster children she and Jim loved. Children, ponies, peacocks, turkeys, ducks, dogs, cats, etc. all added up to a farm full of love and now we at the NDVH get to be her friend as she brings this very positive attitude to all she meets.

He is a McLeod boy, who lived his entire life there, except for his years in the Navy, for which he volunteered in 1944.

His Naval career consisted of serving aboard 3 different ships. Two of which were cargo ships which took him into combat zones plus 1 aircraft carrier.

After the Navy, Harry came home to McLeod and to Annabelle. He is certain that their life together was planned by God before they were born. They lived a mile apart and rode the same school bus together. He always loved her. They were married June 1946. From that marriage came two boys, Bruce and Curtis. From the two boys, Harry now has 3 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren.

Harry and Ann always considered themselves blessed and so they felt an obligation to serve their church and community. He was involved in township activities for 53 years, many church related positions, and is a charter member of the VFW post.

The hardest work Harry remembers doing is hand-digging the holes for power poles for RSR out of Milnor.

Harry was a rancher and with his partner and neighbor, raised beef cattle. After his partner of 25 years died, Harry switched to raising Simmental cattle from Switzerland.

These days Harry's eyesight is poor and limited to his left eye as he lost the use of his right eye doing tractor repair.

Life wasn't all work. In 1947 McLeod joined 8 teams in the newly founded Southern Valley League. Harry was fast and had a good arm so he was the centerfielder for 10 years. One Sunday when McLeod played their rival Wyndmere, though the ticket

prices were 50[¢] per person, they raised \$300.

When asked about his life at the NDVH he said, "I have been here almost 3 years and feel blessed to be in this dream home."




